Parents, correct your children. Commence while they are young, when impressions can be made early and their evil temper subdued before it takes deep root and is strengthened with their strength. Correct your children in love. Do not correct them in passion or let them have their way until even you yourself are angry and then punish them. Correct your children, and then after you have done your duty, carry them to God and ask **God** to help you. Tell Him you have done your part, and then plead with Him to do His part, that you cannot do. Beg of Him to temper their dispositions, to make them mild and gentle by **His Holy Spirit. God** will hear you pray. He will love to answer your prayers. But He despises your prayers while you neglect your duty to your children and then pray Him to do the work for them. God corrects us when we go astray from Him, and you are bound to correct your children when they disobey you and show passion and an evil temper. {Ms3-1854}

You should correct your children in love. Do not let them have their own way until you get angry, and then punish them. Such correction only helps on the evil, instead of remedying it. After you have done your duty faithfully to your children, then carry them to God and ask him to help you. Tell him that you have done your part, and then in faith ask **God** to do his part, that which you cannot do. Ask him to temper their dispositions, to make them mild and gentle by **his Holy Spirit**. He will hear you pray. He will love to answer your prayers. Through his Word he has enjoined it upon you to correct your children, to "spare not for their crying," and his Word is to be heeded in these things. {RH, September 19, 1854 par. 8}

God by His Holy Spirit let light shine forth upon His servants, and the subject gradually opened to their minds. It required much study and anxious care to search it out, link after link. By care, anxiety, and incessant labor has the work moved on until the great truths of our message, a clear, connected, perfect whole, have been given to the world. {1855-1868 1T 79.1}

Read for your own benefit the eighth and ninth chapters of Second Corinthians. Read this instruction over and over again, that you may not only understand but practice the lessons given. Read diligently and prayerfully, and **then give yourselves to the Lord to be guided and controlled by His Holy Spirit**. {Ms71-1900}

They did have a praying season for this poor soul that **the Lord** would, **by His Holy Spirit**, help him to overcome his appetite. We thank the Lord for this evidence that the Holy Spirit is striving with hearts and that conscience is not entirely dead. Souls are starving for the Bread of Life, that they may eat thereof and live. {Ms90-1900}

I awoke at half past twelve. Was very much awake. My mind was traveling, and I dressed and committed my case to **God for His Holy Spirit** and then wrote some things to Brother Prescott. {Ms90-1900}

I awoke at two o'clock a.m. and prepared for my day's work. I see so much to do in writing. I know not what to do first. I seek **the Lord** morning after morning and seek Him in faith, believing He will give me light. **He will bless and He will imbue me with His Holy Spirit.** I prepare large mail for Africa. {Ms90-1900}

It is painful to our **Lord** to see the dwarfed religious life of those who claim to be Christians because they do not properly represent Him to the world. **He would have His Holy Spirit breathed upon all who ask for it in faith. He is more willing to give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him than parents are to give good gifts unto their children.** Do we realize that a consecrated life has a telling influence upon many souls in our world? **Life hid with Christ in God means much, and we are responsible for every hour of our life which has been granted us to form characters for the future life and to respond to the declaration, "We are laborers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building." We are working for time and for eternity. "Write, Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, they do rest from their labors; and their works do follow them." Then glory will come back to God through the living influence of church members who have been doers of the commandments of God. {Ms93-1900}**

I spoke in the afternoon from 2 Peter chapter one. **The Lord gave me the freedom of His Holy Spirit** and I feel very grateful for strength given me to speak. There is a great work to be done here. {Ms93-1900}

I cannot but praise **God** for His goodness and mercies and blessings which are coming to the school and to the church. **The Spirit of the Lord** has come into the school and the report is that every student is now professedly Christians. May the Lord bless them and sanctify them and **refine them by His Holy Spirit**, that they may from henceforth reveal the character of the only true Model which is the character of Christ. I have still an aching head and cannot write the things I would be pleased to write. {Ms94-1900}

Have faith in God. He gave me the idea of giving "Christ's Object Lessons" for the relief of the schools. The converted one sees that his Redeemer lived a life of humility, and he desires to walk in His footsteps. The missionary spirit is awakened in his heart; and, while walking humbly and circumspectly, in accordance with his faith, he can not rest until he is engaged in the work of trying to win souls to Christ. He wants every one to know the preciousness of a Saviour's love. In his work of faith and devoted labor, he will meet with strong temptations and trials, for the Lord tests all His children. If he has the root of the matter in him, he will become more and more firmly established in the truth. If Christ is abiding in his heart by faith, sin appears revolting. The time has come for lifting the standard of truth in many places, for arousing an interest and extending the missionary field until it shall encompass the world. The time has come when many more should have the message of truth brought to their attention. Much can be done in this direction that is not done. While the churches are responsible for keeping their own lamps trimmed and burning, devoted young people must be educated in their own countries to carry forward this work. Schools should be established, not such elaborate schools as those at Battle Creek and College View, but more simple schools with more humble buildings, and with teachers who will adopt the same plans that were followed in the schools of the prophets. Instead of concentrating the light in one place, where many do not appreciate or improve on that which is given them, the light should be carried into many places of the earth. If devoted, God-fearing teachers of well-balanced minds and practical ideas would go into missionary fields and work in a humble way, imparting that which they have received, God would give His Holy Spirit to many who are destitute of His grace. {6T 138.3}

God has committed to us a special work, a work that no other people can do. He has promised us the aid of His Holy Spirit. The heavenly current is flowing earthward for the accomplishment of the very work appointed us. The Lord would inspire men by His Holy Spirit to carry forward the work with faith and courage and perseverance. {AUCR, March 1, 1901 par. 4}

The influence of the Holy Spirit is the life of Christ in the soul. We do not now see Christ and speak to Him, but His Holy Spirit is just as near us in one place as another. "Get ready," is the word sounded in my ears. "Get ready, get ready. He that is to come, will come and will not tarry. I ell my people that unless they improve the sacred opportunities given them, unless they do the work I have given them, Satan will come upon them with the stealthy tread of a thief, to deceive and allure them." God wants us to be wide awake, that when he shall come, we shall be ready to say, "Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us." He is coming to us by his Holy Spirit today. Let us recognize him now; then we shall recognize him when he comes in the clouds of heaven, with power and great glory. God calls upon you to get ready to meet him in peace. {GCB, April 23, 1001 par 8}

It is for all who will dare to be a Daniel, dare to stand alone in Jesus Christ. The ministering angels are waiting, longing for channels through which they can communicate heavenly treasures. **Men and women can reach the highest stage of mental and moral development only by co-operating with Jesus Christ, by learning his methods, by accepting HIS Holy Spirit, by laboring together with Him.** The intellect is never so truly enriched as when we are trying to enrich others. AT THREE O'CLOCK SABBATH AFTERNOON, **MAY 29, 1915**, ELDER G. B. STARR VISITED SISTER WHITE. ELDER STARR FOUND HER IN HER RECLINING CHAIR, IN THE BAY WINDOW OF HER ROOM, LOOKING OUT UPON THE TREES AND HILLS ABOUT HER PLACE. HE REMARKED HOW GLAD HE WAS TO FIND HER AMID SUCH PLEASANT SURROUNDINGS, AND STATED THAT SHE LOOKED MUCH BETTER THAN WHEN HE SAW HER THE TUESDAY BEFORE. {RH, June 17, 1915 par. 9}

TO THIS ELDER STARR SAID: "GOD IS RAISING UP HUNDREDS OF STRONG YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN THROUGH OUR SCHOOLS AND SANITARIUMS, AND IS PUTTING HIS HOLY SPIRIT UPON THEM, AND QUALIFYING THEM TO DO A GREAT AND BLESSED WORK; AND MANY OF THEM ARE DEVOTED, SOBER, EARNEST, AND SUCCESSFUL." {RH, June 17, 1915 par. 13}

SHE REPLIED: "I AM SO GLAD TO HEAR THAT! YOU COULD NOT HAVE TOLD ME ANYTHING MORE ENCOURAGING." {RH, June 17, 1915 par. 14}

Note: <u>EGW died 16th July 1915; 48 days after the above visit</u>. Conclusion: Therefore E.G.White never adopted the trinitarian belief.

To Israel encamped before Mount Sinai the Lord had declared: "I will dwell among the children of Israel, and will be their God. Pray most earnestly for an understanding of the times in which we live, for a fuller conception of His purpose, and for increased efficiency in soulsaving. {Lt7-1913}
